



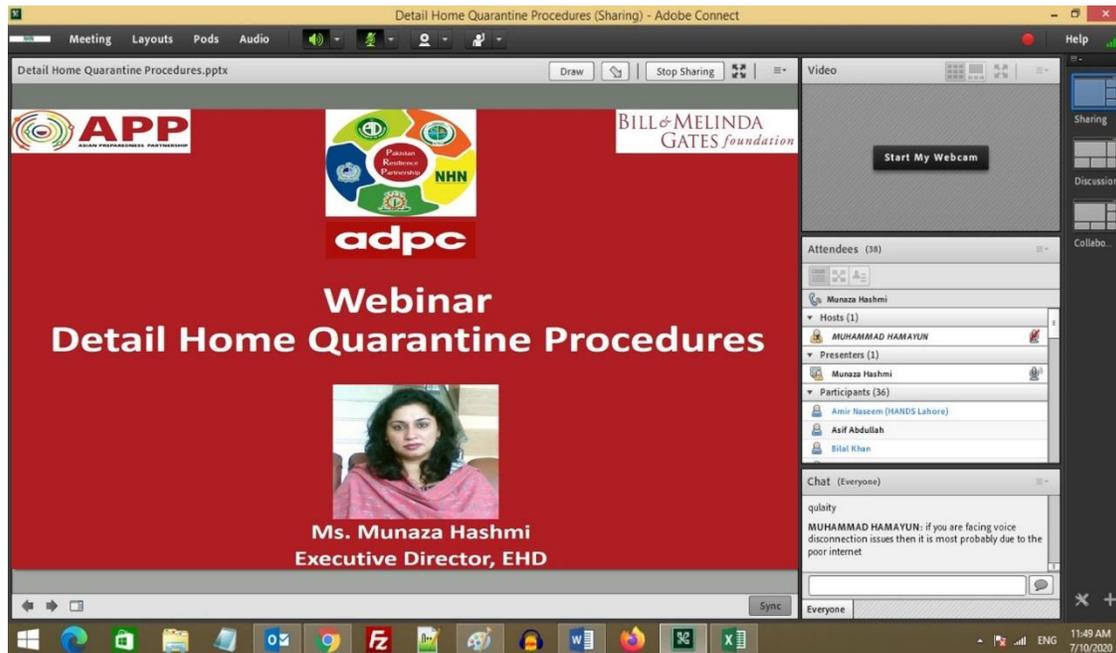
# COVID-19 WEBINAR SERIES



# Webinar 1 - Detail Home Quarantine Procedures

10<sup>th</sup> July 2020

Islamabad, Pakistan



The first webinar of “APP Program Support to Countries during COVID-19 (APP-COVID)”, was held on July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020, at 11:30 hours Pakistan Standard Time (PST) with 38 participants.

Moderator of the session Ms. Sana Zulfiqar, National Coordinator welcomed the participants and introduced the presenter and webinar’s objective. The main purpose of the webinar was to acquaint general public, health workers and the care providers with the guidelines regarding home quarantine of issued by the government.

Ms. Munaza Hashmi a Law graduate and women activist with exposure to visit and work in different countries presented the session. She apprised the participants about the process of quarantine to be followed if one is identified as a contact of a confirmed Covid-19 case. The session helped in addressing the most common questions related to quarantine procedures to be adopted at home. Effectiveness of quarantine during a viral outbreak relies on the timing and accuracy of the quarantine period, as well as the ability of individuals to follow quarantine procedures. The webinar is likely to facilitate/help the organizations to engaged with local community to educate them about the quarantine procedures that shall be adopted at home.

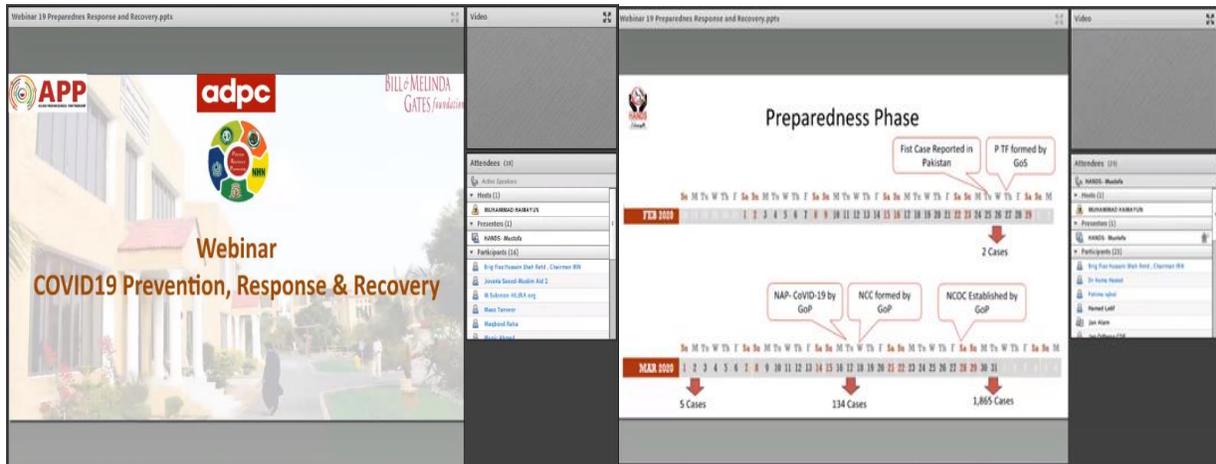

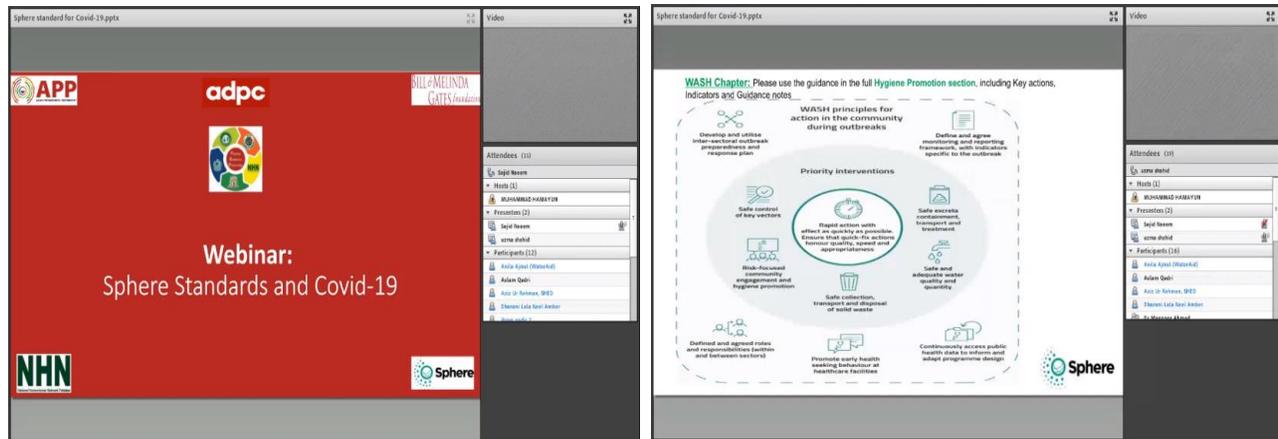
