

### Highlights

- Government has wrapped up its relief activities in KP and Punjab and most part of Balochistan.
- On the onset of winter the people living in cold areas are being provided winter kits.
- The relief activities in Sindh have also been considerably reduced as Government plans to the recovery phase.
- The government is in the process of finalizing Resilient Recovery, Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Framework (4RF) to facilitate the rehabilitation of flood-affected households and communities.
