Highlights

- Relief activities for affected population of Floods 2022, in Punjab have been closed by all humanitarian partners.
- The relief activities in KP, Balochistan and Sindh have been considerably scaled down.
- The country faces threat of yet another flood as heavy rains have been predicted by the Pakistan Metrological Department.
- WFP, Unicef other stakeholders have been reporting that there is a severe nutrition crises in the country.
- Rising food prices and limited livelihood options have further exacerbated the challenge of access to food.








