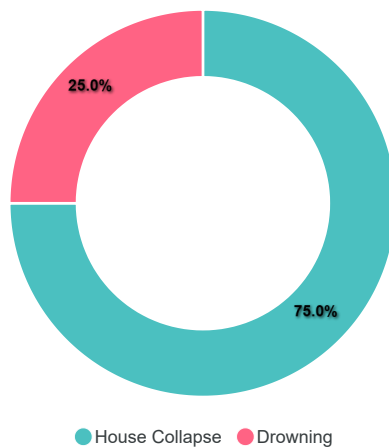

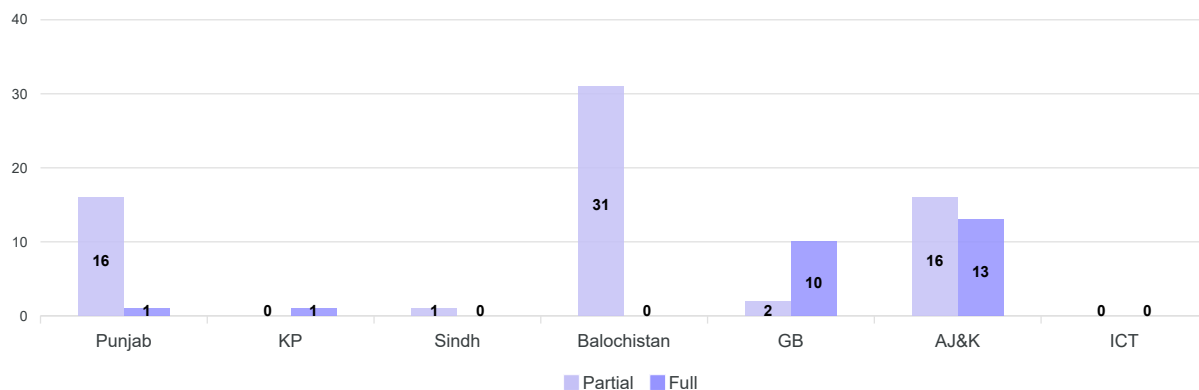
Cumulative Casualties and Injuries - (From 26 June 2026 to 30 July 2026)



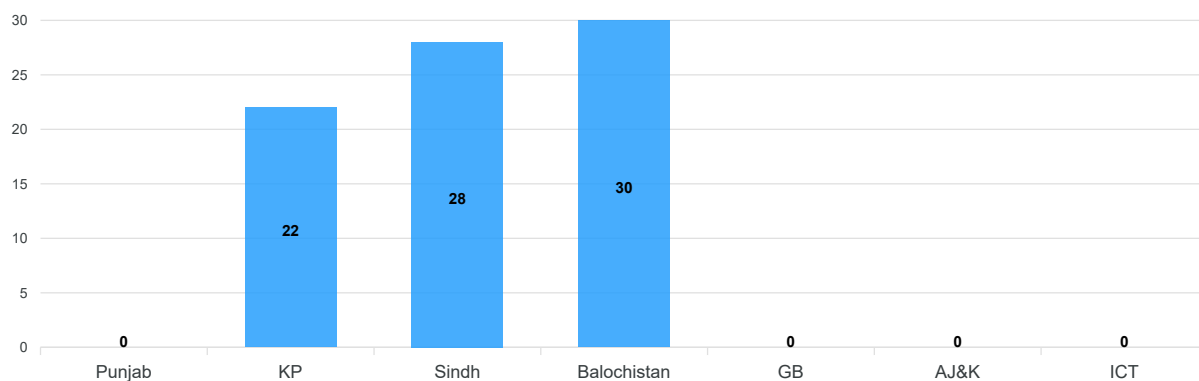

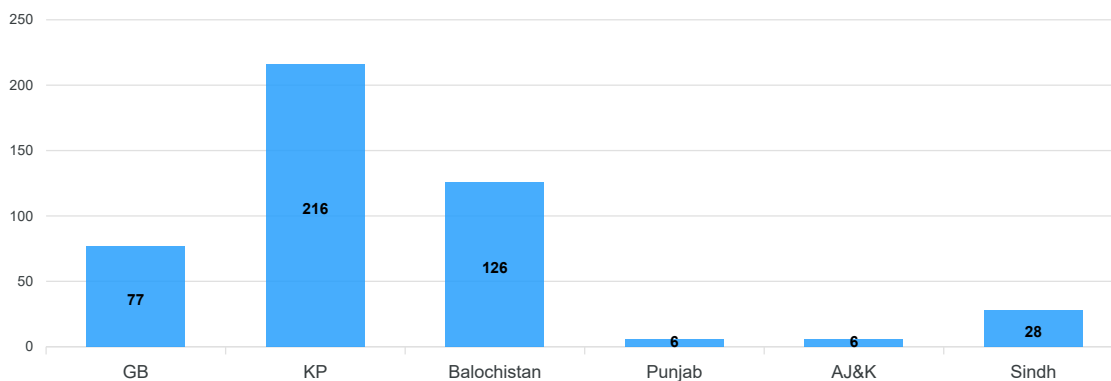

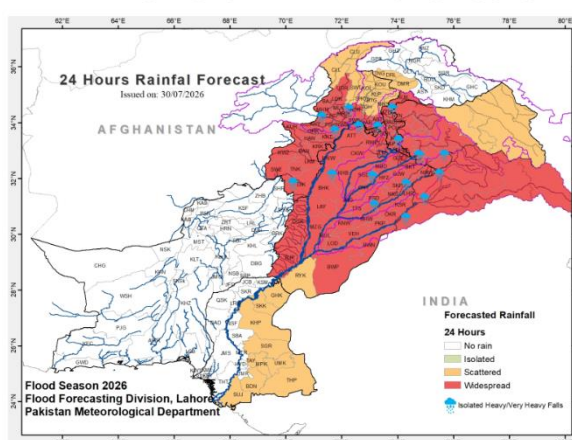

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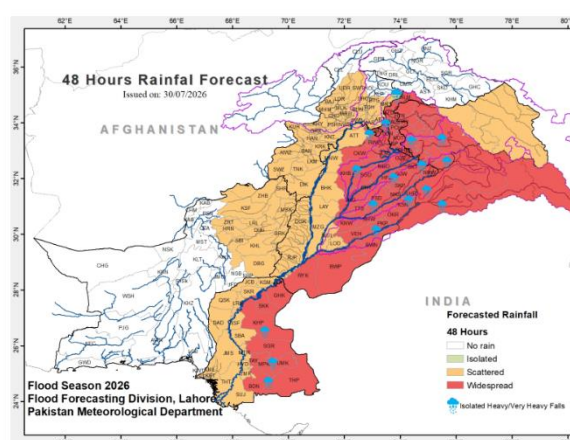

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- **River Indus** at Guddu is in **Medium flood level**, whereas at Kalabagh and Sukkur in **Low flood level** at downstream.
- **River Ravi** at Balloki is in **Low flood level** at upstream.
- River Indus at Guddu will remain in **Medium flood level** at upstream during next 24-36 hours. Whereas, Sukkur will attain **Medium flood level** at upstream during next 24 hours.
- **WARNING:**
 - In the presence of westerly weather system coupled with monsoon currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal, widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy to very heavy falls is expected upto 04th August, consequently,
 - River Chenab at Marala, Khanki and Qadirabad is expected to fluctuate between **Low to Medium flood level** and may attain **High flood level** at Marala during the period.
 - **Medium to High level flows** are expected in nullahs of Jhelum, Chenab (Dora, Dotta, Dowara, Bhimber, Halsi, Aik and Palkhu) and Ravi (Bein, Bassanter, Deg and Sakki).

- **Flash flooding** is expected in the hill torrents of **DG Khan**, the **streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa** and northern Balochistan.
- **Urban Flooding** is also expected in **Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Gujrat, Narowal, Lahore, Okara, Sahiwal and Faisalabad**.
- **Under the influence of approaching deep depression from India, currently lying over west Chattisgarh and adjoining Madhya Pradesh (India), a strong wet spell in which heavy to very falls are expected over south Punjab, central and eastern parts of Sindh from 1st to 4th August.**
- **Consequently, urban flooding, water logging and prolonged water ponding is expected in** Badin, Hyderabad, Jamshoro, Khairpur, Matiari, Mirpur Khas, Sanghar, Shaheed Benazir Abad, Sujawal, Tando Allahyar, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tharparkar, Thatta and Umer Kot during the period.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave is affecting upper parts of the country.
- Yesterday's Deep Depression over north east Chattisgarh (India) today lies over west Chattisgarh and adjoining Madhya Pradesh (India) with central pressure (991 hPa). It is likely to move west northwestwards over south Madhya Pradesh and adjoining Maharashtra (India) within next 24-hours.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northwest Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal (along the foot hills of Himalayan mountains) are penetrating into upper parts of the country up to 5,000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy** to **very heavy falls** is expected over the upper catchments of **Sutlej, Ravi, Chenab Jhelum rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir**
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Bannu, Buner, Charsadda, DI Khan, Hangu, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Dir, Malakand, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Orakzai, Peshawar, Swabi, Waziristan and Tank.

RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

The current wet spell is likely to intensify from 31st July in upper catchments of all the major rivers and Sindh is likely to persist uptill 04th August, 2026.

- **WARNING: Under the influence of an approaching deep depression over India, presently located over west Chhattisgarh and adjoining Madhya Pradesh, a strong wet spell is expected to affect southern Punjab, southeastern Sindh and eastern Balochistan from 1st to 4th August. Heavy to very heavy rainfall is also likely during this period.**
- **Consequently, urban flooding, waterlogging, and prolonged water ponding are likely in** Badin, Hyderabad, Jamshoro, Khairpur, Matiari, Mirpur Khas, Sanghar, Shaheed Benazirabad, Sujawal, Tando Allahyar, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tharparkar, Thatta, and Umerkot districts during the forecast period.
